Past meeting topics included: - Chemical Transport Modeling - Comparing Air Monitoring Techniques - SCAQMD's Laboratory Capabilities - CARB's Emissions Inventory Methodology	SCAQMD formed the TAG immediately after CARB selected their three communities (no vote taken).	SC members and Outside Experts 16 members for all 3 communities: - 3 SC members from each committee - 7 outside technical experts (USC, UCR, Inland Empire Partnership, USEPA, CA Council for Environmental and Economic Balance, Aclima)	- District Identified the TAG members, suggestions were taken.
