

Roadside Vegetation Barriers Workshop

The Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District (SMAQMD) is working with the Sacramento Tree Foundation (STF) to develop local guidelines and best practices for implementing the EPA's *Recommendations for Constructing Roadside Vegetation Barriers to Improve Near-Road Air Quality*, released in July 2016 (Link to EPA document). The proposed guidelines will address important local considerations such as appropriate plant species and maintenance requirements.

The purpose of the workshop is to open a dialogue with local agencies on current vegetation regulations, management practices and preferences so the SMAQMD and STF can best integrate EPA guidance with local needs.

SMAQMD is specifically inviting staff from local agencies including public works, utilities, urban forestry, solid waste, police, planning, and environmental. All perspectives on vegetation are encouraged.
