The proposed revisions will include an update to reflect the Board's actions on the Truck & Bus and Off-Road in-use regulations in December 2010; proposed changes to increase eligibility in all current source categories; expanded funding opportunities with the addition of two new source categories: Emergency Vehicles—Fire Apparatus and Lawn and Garden Equipment Replacement; development of an Off-Road Voucher Incentive Program; additional funding opportunities for fleets currently in compliance with in-use regulations; increased funding opportunities by revising the methodology used to determine surplus emission reductions; addressing co-funding for projects that reduce greenhouse gases based on AB 1507; and streamlining administrative requirements for air districts.
