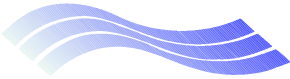

Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP) for  
Automotive Refinishing Operations**

## **IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR OWNERS AND OPERATORS OF AUTOMOTIVE REFINISHING OPERATIONS**

Your facility has been identified as an operation potentially affected by a regulatory action of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The purpose of this letter is to inform you of requirements you may now have to comply with as a result of this action.

On January 9, 2008, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) adopted a National Emission Standard (NESHAP) for paint stripping and miscellaneous surface coating operations (Subpart HHHHHH). As a result of EPA's action, automotive refinishing operations previously exempt from the requirement to obtain a permit from the Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District (SMAQMD) are no longer exempt and must now obtain a SMAQMD permit pursuant to SMAQMD Rule 201, Section 110.2.

Under previous requirements, automotive refinishing operations using less than a gallon/day of paint and solvents combined (small facilities) were exempt from the requirement to obtain a SMAQMD permit. Given that *all* automotive refinishing operations are now subject to NESHAP requirements, all must have a SMAQMD permit to operate, regardless of amounts used.

To facilitate compliance with SMAQMD permit requirements, enclosed you will find an application for a permit to operate. In addition, you will find a pamphlet describing the NESHAP requirements. Please note that in addition to the requirement to obtain a SMAQMD permit there is a federal notification requirement you must complete by January 11, 2010. A form for this notification is enclosed as well.

*Please be advised that operation of any automotive refinishing operation without a SMAQMD permit is now a violation of SMAQMD Rule 201 and subject to penalties as specified in California Health and Safety Code, Section 42402.*

If you are a facility doing automotive refinishing, the SMAQMD hereby requests that you complete and submit an application for a permit with required fee by **August 1, 2009**. To fulfill both local and federal requirements as expeditiously as possible, the SMAQMD recommends you submit a copy of your federal notification form with your application for permit.
