**SUBJECT: Notice of Expiration of Registrations for Tier 0 Portable Equipment**

### ***EXPIRATION OF PORTABLE EQUIPMENT REGISTRATIONS***

You are receiving this Advisory because records maintained by the California Air Resources Board's (CARB) Portable Equipment Registration Program (PERP) indicate that you have portable equipment registration(s) for Tier 0 equipment which are due to expire on December 31, 2010.

CARB originally set the expiration date for this equipment for December 31, 2009. Several notices of the 2009 expiration date already have been issued by CARB. Subsequent to these notices and as a result of concerns expressed by industry, CARB extended the expiration date for these registrations to December 31, 2010.

The purpose of this *Advisory* is to inform holders of registrations for Tier 0 equipment residing in the Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District (SMAQMD) that after December 31, 2010 it will be illegal to use this equipment in the SMAQMD as a result of the statewide expiration of the registrations for this type of equipment.

To facilitate your confirmation of compliance with the PERP regulation and regulations of the SMAQMD, enclosed you will find a *Certificate of Non Operation, Sale, or Disposal* and an attachment which lists the registration(s) at your company due to expire on December 31, 2010. For each registration listed in the attachment, please fill out this form and return to the SMAQMD by January 31, 2011. Failure to return this form by the due date may result in an unannounced inspection of your facility to determine compliance with these requirements.

Please be advised that anyone found using this equipment after expiration of registration is subject to penalties pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Sections 42400 and 42402.
