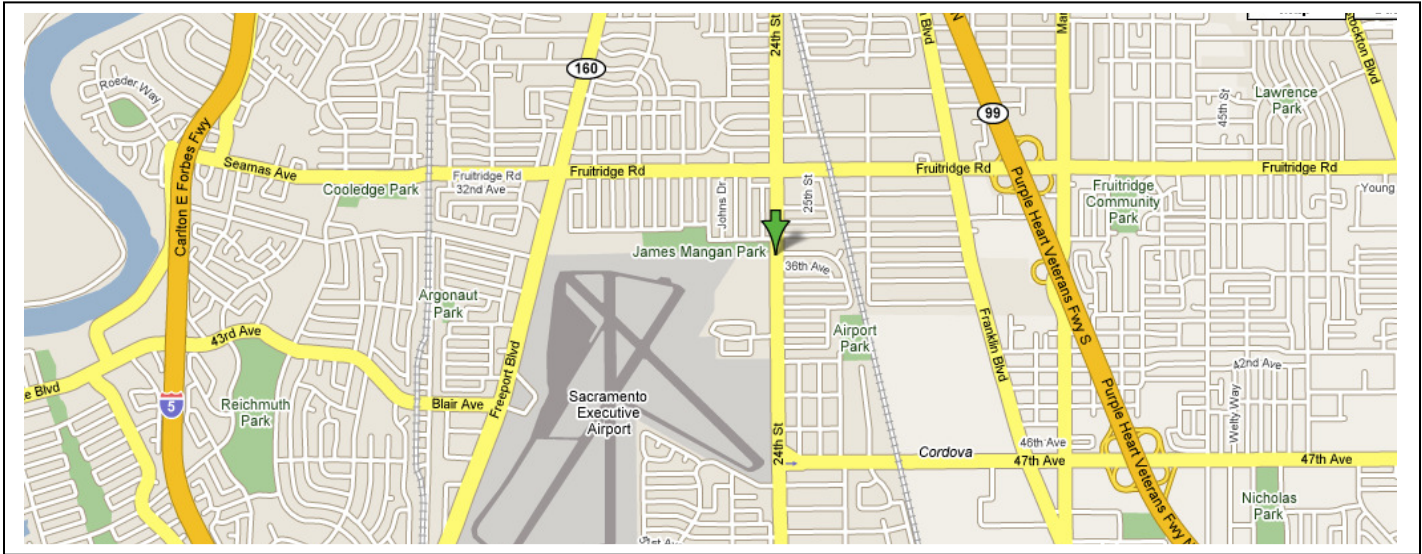

- From I 5, take the Seamas exit east
  - Seamas becomes Fruitridge
  - Continue east on Fruitridge to 24<sup>th</sup> Street south
